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Composition:

Each actuation delivers:

• Fluticasone Furoate: 27.5 mcg

• Azelastine Hydrochloride: 140 mcg

Pharmacological Class:

- Fluticasone Furoate: Corticosteroid (antiinflammatory).
- Azelastine Hydrochloride: Antihistamine (H1 receptor antagonist).

Indications:

This nasal spray is indicated for:

- Allergic Rhinitis: Seasonal and perennial.
- Nasal Congestion and Sneezing: Associated with allergies.
- Itchy or Runny Nose: Due to allergic reactions.

Mechanism of Action:

- Fluticasone Furoate: Reduces nasal inflammation by inhibiting the release of inflammatory mediators.

- 4. Tilt the head slightly forward and insert the nozzle into one nostril.
- 5. Press the pump while breathing in gently through the nose.
- 6. Repeat for the other nostril.
- 7. Wipe the nozzle and replace the cap after use.

Contraindications:

- Hypersensitivity to fluticasone, azelastine, or any excipients in the formulation.
- Use in patients with untreated fungal, bacterial, or viral infections of the nasal passages.

Warnings and Precautions:

- Local Nasal Effects: Risk of nasal septal perforation or ulceration; monitor for symptoms like persistent nasal discomfort.
- Systemic Effects: May cause suppression of the hypothalamic-pituitary-adrenal (HPA) axis with prolonged use.
- Growth Suppression: Monitor growth in pediatric patients during prolonged therapy.
- Glaucoma and Cataracts: Use cautiously in patients with a history of ocular conditions; regular monitoring is recommended.
- Infections: Corticosteroids may mask signs of infection.

Side Effects:

- Common Side Effects:
 - Nasal irritation or dryness
 - o Bitter taste
 - Headache
 - Sneezing
- Serious Side Effects:
 - Epistaxis (nosebleed)
 - Hypersensitivity reactions (rash, swelling, difficulty breathing)
 - Visual disturbances

Drug Interactions:

- Ritonavir and Ketoconazole: May increase systemic exposure to fluticasone, leading to adrenal suppression.
- CNS Depressants: Additive sedative effects with azelastine; avoid alcohol.

Storage:

- Store at a temperature between 15°C to 25°C.
- Protect from light and moisture.
- Keep out of reach of children.

- Available in a metered-dose nasal spray bottle.
