Indications	
Isoxsuprine 10mg tablets are indicated for:	Contraindications

- Hypersensitivity: Known hypersensitivity or allergic reaction to isoxsuprine or any of its components.
- Severe Cardiac Conditions:
 Isoxsuprine should not be used in patients with severe coronary artery disease, myocardial infarction, or arrhythmias.
- Uterine Bleeding: Should be avoided in cases of active uterine bleeding.
- Pregnancy: Isoxsuprine should be used with caution in pregnancy, particularly beyond the first trimester, and only when the benefits outweigh the risks.

Precautions

- Cardiovascular Disease: Use caution in patients with heart disease, arrhythmias, or hypertension as isoxsuprine may cause palpitations or tachycardia (rapid heart rate).
- Pregnancy and Lactation:
 Isoxsuprine should be used in
 pregnancy only if necessary and
 under the guidance of a healthcare
 provider. It is excreted in breast
 milk, so caution is advised when used
 in breastfeeding mothers.
- Renal and Hepatic Impairment: Use with caution in patients with impaired liver or kidney function, as these conditions may affect the metabolism and excretion of the drug.
- Hypotension: Isoxsuprine may cause a drop in blood pressure, especially in patients who are prone to hypotension.

Side Effects

Common side effects may include:

- Dizziness or lightheadedness
- Headache
- Nausea
- Flushing or warm sensation
- Palpitations (a feeling of rapid heartbeats)

Serious side effects are rare but may include:

- Chest pain or discomfort
- Irregular heartbeats (arrhythmias)
- Severe dizziness or fainting
- Shortness of breath
- Swelling of the legs or ankles

If any of these serious side effects occur, immediate medical attention should be sought.

Drug Interactions

- Cardiac Glycosides: Isoxsuprine may exacerbate the side effects of cardiac medications such as digoxin.
- Other Vasodilators: Combining isoxsuprine with other vasodilators (e.g., nitrates) may increase the risk of hypotension or dizziness.

Storage Instructions

- Store at room temperature (15-30°C), away from heat, moisture, and direct sunlight.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- Do not store in the bathroom or areas with high humidity.

Additional Notes

- Regular Monitoring: If used for preterm labor, it is important to monitor maternal and fetal health closely, as long-term use may carry risks.
- Avoid Alcohol: Alcohol should be avoided, as it may enhance the sedative and hypotensive effects of isoxsuprine.
- Gradual Discontinuation: Do not suddenly stop isoxsuprine without medical advice, especially if used for managing preterm labor.

Always follow the instructions of your healthcare provider when using isoxsuprine and inform them of any other medications you are taking to avoid potential interactions or side effects.
