Pantoprazole (40mg) Injection

Description

Pantoprazole Injection is a proton pump inhibitor (PPI) that reduces gastric acid secretion. It is used for treating gastrointestinal conditions requiring short-term acid suppression and is administered intravenously for rapid action.

Composition

- Active Ingredient: Pantoprazole Sodium (equivalent to Pantoprazole 40mg).
- Excipients: Sodium hydroxide, disodium edetate, and water for injection.

Mechanism of Action

Pantoprazole inhibits the H+/K+ ATPase enzyme in the gastric parietal cells, effectively suppressing the final step in gastric acid production. This results in reduced gastric acidity and alleviation of acid-related symptoms.

Indications

- Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD) with esophagitis.
- Zollinger-Ellison Syndrome and other hypersecretory conditions.
- Prevention and treatment of stressinduced gastric ulcers.
- Management of peptic ulcers associated with Helicobacter pylori infection (as part of combination therapy).
- Acid suppression during surgery or in patients unable to take oral PPIs.

Dosage and Administration

Route of Administration: Intravenous (IV).

- Adults:
 - GERD or Erosive Esophagitis: 40mg once daily IV.
 - Zollinger-Ellison Syndrome: Starting dose of 80mg IV, adjusted as needed.
- Children (≥ 1 year, weight ≥ 15 kg):
 - GERD: 1mg/kg/day IV (maximum 40mg/day).

Preparation: Reconstitute the vial with 10mL of 0.9% sodium chloride injection. Administer as a slow IV injection over 2–3 minutes or as an infusion over 15 minutes.

Contraindications

- Hypersensitivity to pantoprazole or other PPIs
- Caution in patients with a history of Clostridium difficile infections or osteoporosis-related fractures.

Precautions

- Liver Impairment: Monitor liver function in long-term use.
- Prolonged Use: May increase the risk of vitamin B12 deficiency, hypomagnesemia, or bone fractures.
- Pregnancy and Lactation: Use only if the benefits outweigh risks.

Side Effects

Common side effects:

- Headache
- Nausea
- Diarrhea or constipation
- Injection site reactions

Rare but serious side effects:

- Severe hypersensitivity reactions (anaphylaxis, Stevens-Johnson syndrome).
- Interstitial nephritis.
- Hypomagnesemia or electrolyte imbalances.

Drug Interactions

- Reduces absorption of drugs requiring acidic pH (e.g., ketoconazole, itraconazole).
- Use cautiously with anticoagulants like warfarin (monitor INR).
- May interact with HIV medications (e.g., atazanavir).

Storage Instructions

- Store below 25°C.
- Protect from light.
- Use immediately after reconstitution or within the recommended time frame if specified by the manufacturer.

Presentation

- Form: Lyophilized powder for injection.
- Packaging: 40mg vial.
